New home for Breast Cancer Help

In June, Breast Cancer Help Inc. celebrated the grand opening of its new Bay Shore facility. The nonprofit, which previously rented a 1,900-square-foot property, also in Bay Shore, purchased and renovated the new facility, which, at close to 3,200 square feet, will allow Breast Cancer Help to broaden the services it offers to cancer survivors.

In the middle part of the last decade, the organization received a grant to purchase a building, but prices were too high at that time. "When the market declined, we finally found a building that we were able to afford," Executive Director Alex Fezza said. "Previously, we were paying almost \$5,000 a month with no return, but now that we own our own property, our hope is that we can go out of business when a cure is found, sell the building and donate the proceeds to another nonprofit in need."
